Luke 10:38-42 NRSV "Make Time To Sit & Listen"

38 Now as they went on their way, he entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. 39 She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. 40 But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me." 41 But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; 42 there is need of only one thing.

Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."

Let us unpack this for a moment. Jesus is traveling and he is invited into Martha's home. Jesus enters her home and Mary, Martha's Sister sits at Jesus' feet and begins listening to what He was saying. As this occurs Martha gets distracted by her many tasks, so she comes to Jesus to complain because her sister has left her to do all the work, with the hope that Jesus would tell her to get up and help. But instead Jesus responds Martha Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things, and there is need for one thing. Mary has chosen that one thing, and it will not be taken away from her.

In this text of scripture Jesus makes the decision to enter Martha's home. Martha makes the decision to focus on her tasks, and Mary makes the decision to sit at Jesus' feet and listen. Of all of the decision making here, the one that Jesus considers to be the better part, was the choice to sit and listen.

As we begin the 2022-23 Sorority Year be sure to make time for communion with Jesus! He is still speaking, which means we must make time to sit and listen. Don't allow the many tasks that all of us juggle to become so overwhelming that you find yourself worried and distracted.

Commit now to making the time to sit and listen, and encourage your Family, Friends and Sorors to do the same! For choosing to do this one thing could be the difference between chaos and peace, worry and wholeness, or distraction and determination.

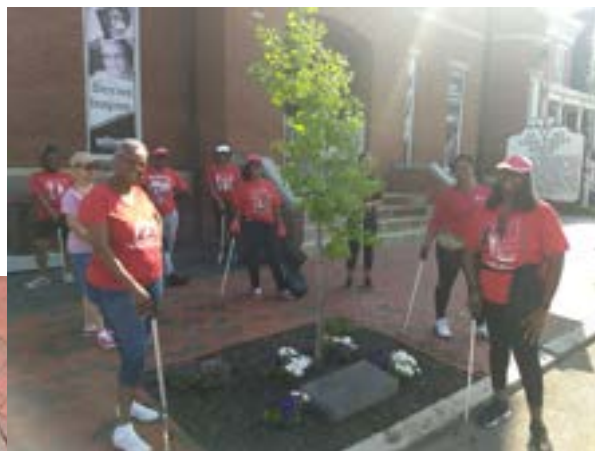

Beekeeping While Black has been accepted into the Afrikana Independent Film Festival which runs September 15th-18th.

At Virginia Commonwealth University she teaches courses on theories and foundations in African American Studies, Blackness in pop culture, and Black storytelling in television and film.

Beekeeping While Black is a narrative-style film that explores the journey of two local black women beekeepers during a beekeeping season. Filled with interviews and footage from work in their bee yards, *Beekeeping While Black* highlights their efforts to create spaces for BIPOC youth and adults, in particular, to better understand their relationship to nature, each other, and themselves. September's Protocol Moment

Welcome Back Sorors!!!

Sorors, it's been a while since we've met in person for a chapter meeting, so just in case you are wondering what you should wear, we thought we would remind you...

When attending **chapter meetings**, you should wear business attire; hats are acceptable excluding baseball hats, cowboy hats, bandanas, or bucket hats.

What is business attire? Delta Business attire is appropriate for most occasions except as specifically noted. Business attire is traditionally a business suit, dress, skirt, pants, sleeveless blouse, blouse, and blazer – clothing, and religious head-wraps that reflects a professional style. Leggings worn as pants are not considered appropriate business meeting attire at any time. Wearing denim of any color and line jackets of any kind or color are inappropriate for any ceremony to include those held at National Convention. Ponchos and shawls containing symbols on one side or the crest on one side are appropriate and can be worn as a covering for business meetings while attending the National Convention. Delta's business attire must satisfy the Sorority's accepted business, social and aesthetic standards.

Now, you're dressed and ready, do you remember how we should greet each other?

Delta to Delta Greeting

The official greeting (title) of those duly initiated into Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. is "Soror," and it should not be combined with another title. If an additional title is appropriate, for example, say "Dr. _____," "Reverend _____" or "Our Esteemed Soror." The titles "Soror Dr.," "Soror Reverend Dr.," and "International President" are not proper protocols in Delta Sigma Theta.

How to Address a Presiding Officer

At chapter meetings, regional conferences, national conventions, and closed Delta assemblies the presiding officer should always be addressed as Soror Insert Last Name (e.g., Soror Jones), or Soror Insert Official Title (e.g., Soror President).

Rap order for meetings and ceremonies

Note: Wait until Raps are completed to perform command

ONE RAP: Attention, Be Seated, End of Ceremony

TWO RAPS: Affirm the Sacred Vow, Affirm the Sacred Trust

Sorores,

The purpose of this communication is to share the decision of the RVA Infinite Scholars Planning Team to forego the in-person RVA Infinite Scholars College Admission/Scholarship Fair scheduled for October 8, 2022. Due to the status of COVID-19 and predictions for the fall, it is neither in the best interest of prospective attendees, members and liability of our organization, nor the community at large to host the event.

Our decision is supported by facts included in weekly updates received from the Center for Disease Control (CDC), Virginia Department of Health (VDH), and the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE). VDH has posted recommendations to help mitigate the spread of the COVID-19 virus particularly when hosting and/or attending large Gatherings and Events in Virginia. However, as late as August 8, 2022, we were reminded that CDC recommendations are not legally binding for activities as described by VDH.

Additional rationale supporting our decision:

- * As predicted, COVID Community Levels have risen to "HIGH" in many localities and surrounding counties, thereby making an in-person event less plausible.
- * VDH states that not all positive cases are being reported.
- * Volunteers, community supporters, and several regional college reps with whom we worked prior to hosting our first ISP Fair are also quite skeptical about moving forward with an in-person event.

Despite not requesting assistance from supporters for the past two years, we have received funds from several contributors. Therefore, we have requested the assistance of local school administrators and counselors in identifying deserving 2022 High School Graduates who will begin their college experience in August/September 2022 and would benefit receiving additional financial assistance. Guidelines for requesting assistance will be the same student portfolio as requested for admission to the annual in-person RVA Infinite Scholars Fair.

As always, we sincerely appreciate your tremendous support, assistance, and commitment to the success of this project for the past 14 years. We encourage you to continue taking pride and sharing ownership in knowing that you have worked to prepare, assist, and connect an overwhelming number of high school students in the Commonwealth of Virginia and colleges across the United States as summarized on the attached document.

Should a virtual event be approved for later this year, we trust that you will be willing to assist.

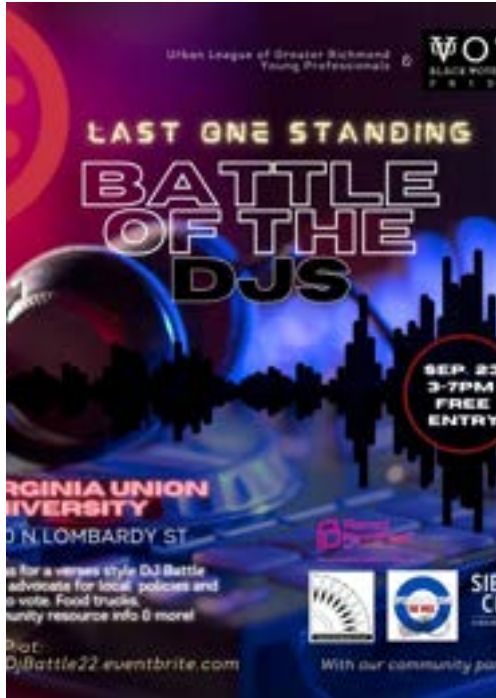

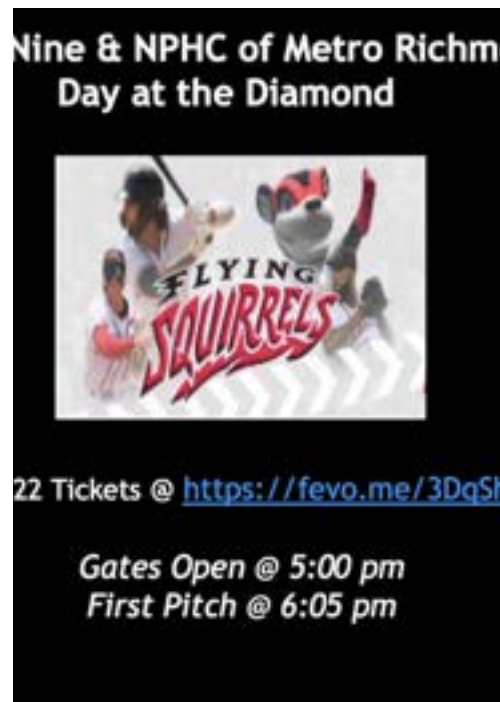
