


December 17 th - Red Shoe Revue

"Psst...Could You Do Me a Favor?" Email Scam

Familiar with this scenario?

Have you received an email from a well-known friend, family member, or organization that is asking you for help? An email subject line that starts out as 'Can You Help Me?' or 'I Need a Favor'. Being the financial, savvy soror that you are, you check the email address of the sender and notice that the email address is indeed legitimate. And the sender of the email gives an excuse of "traveling" or being in a predicament where she can not call you directly with the request. But the body of the email has spelling errors - which is a red flag. And the favor that is asked is a monetary gift card that can be given to either another friend in immediate need or a charity organization.

By now, many of you may have already been a recipient of an email scam or have been a victim of a hacked email account. If you were the recipient of the email, you likely ignored the email or deleted it. And if you were a victim of the hacked email account, you likely endured the calls from friends and family and apologized for the phishing email that was sent using your name.

How to Handle this Scam?

If you have received this type of phishing scam, it's best to not respond and just call the owner of the account. Although these emails are coming from the actual owner's account, the scammer is betting that he will notice --> read --> respond --> delete emails in the owner's account prior to the owner noticing any of the activity. It's better to call the owner of the account and notify her that the account may have been compromised. Never click on any links within the email's message. And don't buy or send any gift cards!

If you were a victim of a hacked account, it's important to move fast and secure your account. Most likely, no personal information has been compromised. However, you don't want the scammer reading your incoming emails...learning your lifestyle, or whom you associate with in business. Follow these simple steps to secure your account:

- 1. Change your password. Don't use the same or similar password that is used for other online accounts.
- 2. Check your Managed Device panels and make sure you recognize all devices that have permission to your email address
- 3. Set up a Two-Factor Authentication. Yes, this type of authentication can be annoying and time-consuming each time you try to log into your email account. However, it makes it extremely hard for your account to be hacked
- **4.** Check your Recovery settings. Recovery settings either have a secondary phone number or email address that the email company can send authentication codes or email notifications in case your primary email account is not working. Make sure that the scammer has not set up his own email address as a secondary communication.
- 5. Check if your email or phone has been put on a data breach report by checking out https://haveibeenpwned.com


