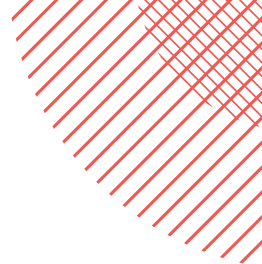



A SPECIAL ELECTION for the 4th District (Virginia) of the United States House of Representatives has been scheduled for February 21, 2023.

Below is important information for all voters of the 4th Congressional District regarding early / absentee voting, which is currently underway, and Election Day, Tuesday, February 21, 2023:

Candidates:

- Democratic – *Jennifer L. McClellan*
- Republican – *Leon Benjamin, Sr.*

Important Dates:

- o Saturday, February 11, 2023: Voter registration offices open for early voting.
- o Tuesday, February 14, 2023: Deadline to register to vote or update an existing registration. (Voters may register after this date, through Election Day, and vote using a provisional ballot).
- o Saturday, February 18, 2023, at 5:00 p.m.: The last day of in-person early voting at your local voter registration office.
- o Tuesday, February 21, 2023: ELECTION DAY. Polls open at 6:00 am and close at 7:00 pm. As long as you are in line by 7:00 pm, you will be able to vote.

ERT STARTS THE YEAR OFF RIGHT WITH BLOOD DRIVE

The Emergency Response Team didn't start the new year with resolutions but we did bring in donations – blood donations. ERT partnered with St. Philip's Episcopal Church for another successful blood drive on Saturday, Jan. 7, 2023.

There, 26 donors and 23 units of blood were collected. Those units can help as many as 69 patients! Our own RAC President Vanessa Evans was one of the generous donors.

As always, ERT was on hand to help register and greet blood donors at the door. And the "Delta Donor Door Prizes" brought smiles to the faces of our sorors.



How to Perform Hands-Only CPR

- 1 Ensure the person is on their back on a firm, flat surface
- 2 Kneel beside the person.
Your knees should be near the person's body and spread about shoulder width apart.
- 3 Use correct hand placement
Place the heel of one hand in the center of their chest, with your other hand on top. Interlace your fingers and make sure they are up off the chest
- 4 Use correct body position
Position your body so that your shoulders are directly over your hands. Lock your elbows to keep your arms straight
- 5 Give continuous compressions.
Push hard and fast (at least 2 inches; 100 to 120 compressions per minute). The song "Staying Alive" by the Bee Gees provides the recommended rhythm.
- 6 Allow chest to return to its normal position after each compression

Importance of CPR

If you see a teen or adult suddenly collapse, hands-only CPR is the recommended form of cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). It not only increases the likelihood of surviving breathing and cardiac emergencies that occur outside of medical settings, but it's simple to learn and easy to remember.

Before Giving CPR

1 Check the scene and the person.

Check to make sure the scene is safe, tap the person on the shoulder to see if they're OK, and look for signs of rhythmic, normal breathing.

2 Call 911 for assistance.

If there's no response from the victim when asked if he or she is OK, call 911, or ask a bystander to call for help.

3 Begin compressions.

If the person is unresponsive, perform hands-only CPR.

The time has come to renew your annual chapter and Grand Chapter dues for Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated's extended 2022-2023 fiscal year. **Dues for July 1, 2023 - December 31, 2023 are payable now through March 31, 2023.**

FISCAL YEAR CHANGE

As you may recall, Grand Chapter elected to move the annual accounting period to a calendar year fiscal reporting beginning January 2024. **Grand Chapter has also elected to extend the 2022-2023 membership period by six months to accommodate the change in the fiscal year.** Payments of membership dues at this time will make you financial for the extended 2022-2023 fiscal year and eligible to participate in all activities from July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023.

MEMBER PAYMENT TO CHAPTER

Chapter dues for the **extended 2022-2023 fiscal year** are payable January 1, 2023 through March 31, 2023, if you are a member of a local chapter. For those currently financial for 2022-2023, no further late or reinstatement fees will be applied, as the national dues have been paid. However, each member must pay six months of chapter dues (\$77.50) by July 1, 2023, to keep financial status for the extended period of July 1, 2023 – December 31, 2023. **You will go into a non-financial status if you do not pay the associated chapter dues.**

Please mail your personal check, certified check or money order to the chapter's P.O. Box or use the Square link 2023 Annual Dues. If Square is used, you will be responsible for paying the convenience fee.

If you are reclaiming a Soror or are currently not financial for the 2022-2023 sorority year, please remember that Sorors must pay dues for July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023 **before** they may pay dues for July 1, 2023 – December 31, 2023.

AWARDED \$30,000 IN MIDYEAR SCHOLARSHIPS

Richmond Alumnae Delta House Foundation, Incorporated in partnership with Richmond Alumnae Chapter, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated has for the past fourteen years presented the RVA Infinite Scholars College Admission/Scholarship Fair as support for the chapter's educational development thrust. Since 2008 the Infinite Scholars Program has operated under the auspices of Delta House Foundation to maintain Richmond Alumnae Chapter's history of uninterrupted annual compliance.

Due to COVID a virtual event was presented in 2020. In 2021 and 2022 events were cancelled. In 2022 contributors and the Infinite Scholars Program Planning Team agreed to utilize available funds to provide midyear scholarships to deserving 2022 Richmond Public Schools graduates.

On December 22, 2022, a celebration for six Richmond Public Schools 2022 graduates and their parents was convened in Richmond City Council Chambers. Students were collectively awarded a total of \$30,000 in scholarships as they returned to college in pursuit of their second semester of undergraduate studies.

Richmond City Council President Cynthia Newbille, Richmond School Board Chair Shonda Harris-Muhammed, and Virginia House of Delegates Representative Delores L. McQuinn joined other city leaders, contributors, Delta House Foundation Board Members, Richmond Alumnae Chapter President Vanessa Evans, and Infinite Scholars Planning Team Members to salute students and parents.

DROP OFF

Some sites offer a drop-off service, allowing customers to meet and share tax documents with an IRS-certified tax preparer. A team will then complete the returns and customers will schedule a follow-up appointment at the tax site to review, approve and file the tax return.

If you earn \$73,000 or less annually, you qualify to receive free coaching from an IRS-certified volunteer to help you successfully file your tax return.
