

Thanks are extended to all who participated in this year's **"Read** Across America" program that was held February 27 – March 3, 2023, at two Richmond Preschools: Mary Scott and Maymont, and three elementary schools: Woodville, Redd, and Blackwell. Reading is one of the doorways to incalculable proficiencies and possibilities and it positions children on the track to a life of success and discovery. We continue to be proud to support this program annually that was initially started by Soror Lola

McDowell. This year's event was quite successful! We read to more than 200 children and various leaders in our city volunteered their time and talent including Mayor Levar Stoney, Superintendent Jason Karmas, the Interim State Superintendent of Public Instruction, Aimee Rogstad Guidera, Councilwoman Ann-Frances Lambert, members from the Richmond City Sheriff's Office, officers that serve in the Richmond Police and Fire Departments, members from the Virginia Education Association, school social workers, current and former RPS employees, our own Richmond Alumnae Sorors, and other outstanding community members.



Plans are proceeding for *SWAP* (Students with a Promise). SWAP is a program designed to inspire, motivate, and celebrate the strengths and "promise" of students who have made significant gains in reading and language arts. It is intended to increase self-esteem and encourage students to continue striving to be successful. School personnel from each Richmond school are asked to recommend students based on academic and personal growth. Students in grades 3, 5, 6, and 9 are then recognized with a gift card and a certificate during an end-of-the-year program.



Additionally, plans are being arranged for our annual *College Shower* that will conclude in June 2023. While academic readiness is often the focus of college preparation for high school students, it is just one of many factors to consider. One recommended soon-to-be-college student from Open and Huguenot High School will receive a "College Shower" to provide some of the basic necessities and essentials for college life. Committee members will assist identified students in creating an account on Amazon or another website of their choice. Students will then select the gifts they would like to

receive, up to a maximum of \$300.00. The "shopping spree" allows students the ability to personalize their new living spaces by getting the things they need to have a wonderful first year experience in college.

Richmond Alumnae Chapter members recently traveled to Washington, DC to participate in the 34th Delta Days in the Nation's Capital from March 25-28th! Established in 1989 by the National Social Action Commission, Delta Days in the Nation's Capital is an annual legislative conference to increase our involvement in the national public policy-making process. The conference includes legislative briefings, issue forums, and advocacy skills development. The conference culminates with a day of advocacy at the capitol with visits to the offices of federal legislators in the United States Senate and House of Representatives. The 2023 Conference marked the 60th anniversary of the establishment of the National Social Action Commission, which included Delta Sigma Theta Social Action Awards being presented to many notable legislators who represent the communities we serve.





The time has come to renew your annual chapter and Grand Chapter dues for Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated's extended 2022-2023 fiscal year. Dues for July 1, 2023 - December 31, 2023 are payable now through March 31, 2023.

FISCAL YEAR CHANGE

As you may recall, Grand Chapter elected to move the annual accounting period to a calendar year fiscal reporting beginning January 2024. Grand Chapter has also elected to extend the 2022-2023 membership period by six months to accommodate the change in the fiscal year. Payments of membership dues at this time will make you financial for the extended 2022-2023 fiscal year and eligible to participate in all activities from July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023.

MEMBER PAYMENT TO CHAPTER

Chapter dues for the extended 2022-2023 fiscal year are payable January 1, 2023 through March 31, 2023, if you are a member of a local chapter. For those currently financial for 2022-2023, no further late or reinstatement fees will be applied, as the national dues have been paid. However, each member must pay six months of chapter dues (\$77.50) by July 1, 2023, to keep financial status for the extended period of July 1, 2023 – December 31, 2023. You will go into a non-financial status if you do not pay the associated chapter dues.

Please mail your personal check, certified check or money order to the chapter's P.O. Box or use the Square link 2023 Annual Dues. If Square is used, you will be responsible for paying the convenience fee.

If you are reclaiming a Soror or are currently not financial for the 2022-2023 sorority year, please remember that Sorors must pay dues for July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023 before they may pay dues for July 1, 2023 – December 31, 2023.
