It is intended to increase self-esteem and encourage students to continue striving to be successful. School personnel from each Richmond school were asked to recommend students based on academic and personal growth. Students in grades 3, 5, 6, and 9 were recognized with a gift card and a certificate. This year, seventeen elementary schools participated, 6 middle schools and 4 high schools.

The College Shower was also successful! One student from Huguenot High School and one from John Marshall High School were selected to receive this year's **Shower**. While academic readiness is essential for college preparation, it is just one of many factors to consider. The "Shower" provides some of the necessities and essentials for college life. CPR, FIRST AID TRAINING GETS SORORS CERTIFIED, READY FOR AN EMERGENCY

If someone collapsed in front of you, what would you do? About 15 sorors and several community members found out Saturday, May 20, after Chapter Meeting at Huguenot High School.

Certified American Red Cross Instructor Ed Gates, Sr. took participants through an interactive and informative session on CPR and first aid that also kept everyone entertained.

Participants learned that the first thing we should do if someone collapses is call 911. While someone calls 911, you should check to see if the person is breathing. If they are not breathing, begin CPR if you are trained. The CPR mannequins gave participants a real workout in getting trained and certified. Mr. Gates also covered basic first aid training for cuts, scrapes and burns.

Hopefully the participants will never have to use this training, but in the event they do, they are ready to help in case of emergency.

What is $\Delta \Sigma \Theta$ business attire?

Delta Business attire is appropriate for most occasions except as specifically noted. Business attire is traditionally a business suit, dress, skirt, pants, sleeveless blouse, blouse, and blazer -- clothing, and religious head-wrap that reflects a professional style. Delta's business attire must satisfy the Sorority's accepted business, social and aesthetic standards.















(#1) Leggings worn as pants are not considered appropriate business meeting attire at any time. (#2) Wearing denim of any color and (#3) line jackets of any kind or color are inappropriate for any ceremony.







Ponchos and shawls containing symbols on one side or the crest on one side are appropriate and can be worn as a covering for business meetings.

DELTA SIGMA THETA SORORITY INC. has established attire protocol for its various ceremonies. Non-adherence means non-admission. Visiting sorors CANNOT be excused from wearing proper attire at Rites of Passage ceremonies.
